The MMIA Board of Directors hereby adopts the following MMIA policy for purposes of protecting our Service Provider's rights .

The Montana Municipal Interlocal Authority's (MMIA) services providers are afforded certain basic rights concerning business ethics while providing services. These basic rights include:

1. Expect to be treated consistently with dignity, respect, and professionalism.
2. Not be expected to provide gifts, perks or other benefits to members of MMIA's governing body or staff members (or any person or organization associated with them) as a condition of doing business with MMIA.
3. Expect fair and equitable treatment in the procurement process. Every competitive bidding process should be open, well defined and transparent. MMIA recognizes that there is a direct cost to the service provider in preparing every service proposal.
4. Expect to have a written service agreement, specifying all terms and conditions of their contractual relationship.
5. Only be expected to provide services contained within the scope of their service agreement.
6. Be paid in a timely manner for services rendered in accordance with the provisions of their service agreement.
